### ***The making of myhab...***

James Dunlop, 24, came up with the idea for myhab as a student at Bristol UWE. He noticed that several thousand tents were cold-heartedly abandoned at festivals each year. Not only did this mean a shed load of clearing up to do for the organisers, but it also meant **tons of un-recyclable rubbish** ended up in landfill after each event.

James' solution: a **reusable/recyclable, luxury accommodation service** for festival-goers, as an affordable, green alternative to shivering in and then abandoning a soggy tent.

James won the prestigious New Designers award (2006) which gave him the confidence to turn his idea into a business.

After much planning and consideration James decided to seek funding in the city. In a Dragon's Den style situation, James pitched his idea to city firm MINT who offered him investment to realise the business. . . .

The myhab service saves festival-goers the hassle of taking and pitching a tent (if they can find a decent spot). And it helps the organisers by reducing the number of orphaned tents they need to get rid of. myhab is affordable, green, luxury and, dare we say it, pretty darn cool.
